3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Clear, Colorless to Light Yellow Liquid. Vinegar Odor. May Cause Eye Irritation.

EFFECTS OF ACUTE EXPOSURE

EYES:

May cause severe eye irritation. Symptoms may include pain, tearing, redness, and clouding of the eye surface.

SKIN:

May cause mild skin irritation. Symptoms may include redness.

INHALATION:

High concentrations of vapor or mist may cause nose, throat and respiratory tract irritation. Symptoms may include coughing.

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INGESTION:

May cause mild mouth, throat and stomach irritation. Symptoms may include nausea. Ingestion may lead to aspiration into the lungs causing lung injury.

EFFECTS OF CHRONIC EXPOSURE:

Prolonged or repeated contact may cause skin irritation.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS AGGRAVATED:

May aggravate pre-existing eye, skin and respiratory conditions.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

EYES:

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water while holding eyelids apart. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at least 15 minutes. Do not put any medication in the victim's eyes unless instructed by a physician. Get immediate medical attention.

SKIN:

Flush with water, then wash with soap and water. Remove saturated clothing. Get medical attention if irritation develops.

INHALATION:

Remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give respiration; if breathing is difficult, give oxygen (by trained personnel only). Get medical attention if symptoms persist.

INGESTION:

Do not induce vomiting. Drink large quantities of water. Get immediate medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

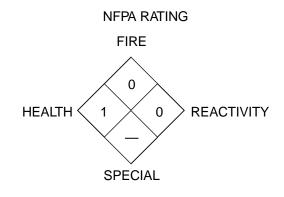
